Dear friends and neighbours of Haliburton County,

This past week, while there was no major announcement or changes to share with you, HHHS continued to work hard on our preparations to address COVID-19 and non-COVID-19 needs in our community.

Our new 15 acute care beds (in addition to our original 15 beds) are operational and ready to accept patients. We have begun to use our two sites in Minden and Haliburton in a new way to try to keep COVID-19 and non-COVID-19 needs separated as much as possible. We are implementing further measures to separate both Long-Term Cares facilities (Highland Wood and Hyland Crest) from the hospitals, and better protect the health and safety of our residents. And we are doing everything possible to protect and maintain the health and safety of our staff team, so that they can continue providing the best care possible to patients, residents, and clients.
